Isle Royale research volunteer shares insight Nov. 14

The predator/prey project on Isle Royale has been around since 1958

and is the longest such study in the world. It has the largest collection of moose bones in the world.

"It is in our back yard, and some-

thing of which Michiganders can be proud, yet it is not as well-known as it probably should be," said our November speaker, Ron Porritt.

Porritt's role is that of a volunteer — a citizen-scientist. He goes to the island each May with "Moosewatch" to help collect bones and observe the ecosystem of Isle Royale.

In recent years, the wolf population has waned, and wolves have become a less-viable predator. This has allowed the moose and beaver population to grow and significantly impact the balance in the ecosystem. Given that the island is a designated wilderness, discussions naturally turn to the subject of how to regenerate the wolf population, and if that

Upcoming changes to MSU retirement plans

Beginning October 17, 2022, MSU is making three changes to its retirement plans. These changes include 1) recordkeeping fee changes; 2) a new TIAA annuity contract and investment option changes; and 3) the movement of legacy pre-2012 account balances.

These retirement plan changes were originally intended to take place in May 2020 but were put on hold due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The university is now moving forward with these changes beginning in October 2022.

- 1. In terms of fee changes, participants pay a record-keeping fee to their retirement vendor(s). The amount of these fees is currently a percentage of the participant's account balance; in other words, the higher the account balance, the higher the fee. MSU has negotiated with the vendors to transition to a flat dollar fee. This means that each participant will pay the same plan recordkeeping fee at the same vendor, regardless of any participant's account balance.
- 2. MSU is moving to a new annuity contract with TIAA because we expect the new contract will allow MSU to reduce investment expenses and potentially increase long-term performance without being tied

- to specific investment options in these types of accounts. There will also be a few investment changes in the core investment menu at TIAA. If you are not currently making contributions to an account at TIAA, you may not be affected by the new annuity contract.
- 3. Some participants may have a legacy pre-2012 account balance if they kept investment accounts held with deselected retirement vendors or in accounts no longer part of MSU's core investment menu at TIAA and Fidelity. In 2012, MSU reduced the number of retirement vendors from six to two, to follow best practice recommendations for compliance with federal regulations. Deselected vendors include Lord Abbett, Vanguard, Equitable (formerly AXA Equitable), and AIG Retirement (formerly VALIC). Current vendors include Fidelity and TIAA; note, however, that current vendors also have pre-2012 accounts with legacy investment options.

Participants who have a pre-2012 mutual fund account at Fidelity, Lord Abbett, TIAA, or Vanguard, can determine whether they would like to take action to

October Topic Spotlight: Passive PPO

Your Humana Group Medicare Advantage PPO Plan is a passive PPO, which means that you will have a large network of providers, specialists and hospitals to choose from. You will pay the same amount for covered care services whether your care is received from an in- or out-of-network provider.

Through your PPO, you may visit any Medicare-approved provider or hospital, and no referral is required to see any healthcare provider.

If you choose to see an out-of-network provider, which means they are not contracted with Humana, it is important to verify that the provider accepts Medicare and is willing to bill Humana. For covered services, if the out-of-network provider accepts Medicare and is willing to bill Humana, your care will be covered, per the plan benefits and coverage guidelines. If a provider is unwilling to bill Humana or you have other questions about a provider's status, please call Humana Customer Care at 800-273-2509 (TTY: 711), Monday - Friday, 8 a.m. - 8 p.m., Eastern time or visit Humana.com.

move these investments to a current investment option at Fidelity or TIAA; if so, participants may take action to move these investments within the set time-frame given by the vendor(s); otherwise, MSU will direct the vendors to move these balances into pre-selected accounts. Participants who have a pre-2012 annuity account at TIAA, Equitable (formerly AXA Equitable), or AIG Retirement (formerly VALIC), should review their annuity investments and work with the vendor(s) to determine if those investments are still appropriate for the participant's retirement investment goals. If not, they should work with the vendor(s) to transfer balances to the approved investment options at Fidelity or TIAA.

MSU Human Resources sent a letter about these changes to individuals who are impacted in early September. Impacted individuals will also receive communication directly from the vendor(s) with detailed instructions for any actions they may want to consider.

Straight to the Point

Market Update - Markets have seen their share of ups and downs in recent months, with more likely to come. After bottoming out in June, we saw a nice rally in stocks that lasted through mid-August. More recently stocks have given back some of the gains and bond yields have risen back near the highs of the year. The Fed remains entrenched in their rate-raising policy, as they continue to combat inflation. Geopolitics also remains a key area of interest. The ongoing war in Ukraine, and the economic battle between Russia and the West threatens energy supplies, possibly leading to natural gas shortages in Europe as we head into the winter season.
